



Citizens' Day in Rosemère Montreal Symphonic Orchestra fills the Rosemère air

The Orchestre symphonique de Montréal (OSM) was on Saturday the 20th of August night in Rosemère, in the Laurentians, as part of the Celebration of the citizens of the municipality, which brought together a large crowd.

This show in the middle of nature in the school park of the Externat Sacré-Coeur allowed nearly 10,000 people to enjoy their evening, which began with a short performance by the Stage Band of the Externat Sacré-Coeur, which would be accompanied by the OSM. The Stage Band is made up of seasoned music lovers who want to surpass themselves. Year after year, this musical ensemble manages to stand out on various stages. Indeed, these 2nd cycle musicians have the opportunity to make their jazzy melodies heard during competitions or concerts.

"This is the biggest show ever in Rosemère. Gathering so many people for a concert is a first. It is not every day that the region welcomes thousands of Ouebecers for an outdoor concert. "said the mayor of Rosemère, Eric Westram, a few minutes before the start of the event.

Under the theme of tales and legends from around the world, the OSM musicians presented several pieces known as "Moonlight", 'Scheherazade" and "The Night Owl".

The whole thing was hosted by actress Magalie Lépine-Blondeau, who acts as spokesperson for the event. "The concert is part of a long tradition initiated by Wilfrid Pelletier in 1938," she recalled in her welcoming address.

In a touching tribute to Mike Bossy, a renowned hockey player who died of lung cancer last April, the OSM performed a superb version of the theme song for "Hockey Night" in Canada.

"The theme of legends will take on its full meaning during this evening," it was said in a press release.

The show ended on a high note with fireworks to end the evening.

Boisbriand neighbourhood shaken by car explosion

A Porsche is destroyed after being engulfed in flames in Boisbriand

The suspicious explosion of a Porsche in a Boisbriand parking lot on this past Monday thee 15th of August 2022 morning literally shook an entire neighbourhood, where residents are nonetheless accustomed to calm.

"I swear to you, I had never heard anything so noisy, said Jacqueline Francoeur to the media. She lives not far from the crime scene. It was dreadful. Citizens who were jolted from their sleep around 3:30 a.m. contacted 911 on Monday when they found that a major fire had broken out on rue des Francs-Bourgeois. This Porsche targeted by a suspicious explosion is a total loss after being ravaged by flames. The fire occurred around 3:30 a.m. Monday the 15th of August in a parking lot in Boisbriand.

A Porsche probably exploded before falling prey to imposing flames which rose very high in the sky. "I went out to look in my yard. I just saw lots of fire," said a local resident, whose car was only a few meters from the one that was targeted. The 19-year-old young man specified that the burned vehicle is regularly in this



parking lot. When we passed, however, only its broken fire-ravaged hull remained, gnawed by the flames.

A resident in the neighborhood also claimed to have seen a man dressed in black quickly leave the scene of the crime. Most of the residents

mentioned being shaken by the gravity of the event, but still felt safe.

Related to other crimes?

The Régie intermunicipale de police Thérèse-De Blainville indicated that it was

collaborating with other police organizations, because this event could be linked to other crimes that have occurred in various territories. "It's a signature that we recognize," said spokesperson Martin Charron. No injuries were reported to authorities.

Shots fired in Two Mountains

Police in The City of Two Mountains are investigating shots that were fired Tuesday morning. 911 calls reported gunshots heard near the 15e Avenue and Boulevard du Lac.

Police officers dispatched to the scene, found bullet casings and projectile strikes on two vehicles and on a residence. According to a police spokesman a family of two adults and four children under the age of 10 was inside the residence.

No one was injured from the family, which is not known to police circles. Police officers are looking for witnesses to the event.

What's in store for Canada and the US, two of the world's leading democracies?

Is there a light at the end of the tunnel? Are there any answers to many difficult questions?

s the current political/geographical divisive reality prevails in both Canada and The Excited States south of us, the question to ask in both places: Where are these countries headed?

The Americans are cursed with the challenge of applying the practical and simple definition of what constitutes a country - a geopolitical entity with defined borders, dividing lines with other countries that are respected and effectively enforced, not out of the non-sensical woke accusation of racism and bias toward prospective immigrants, but more so out of appreciation for the logical rules that must be applied if every potential immigrant is to be treated fairly. Open borders are an unacceptable and too-often inhuman free-for-all that serves no purpose other than to corrupt the very essence of a fair and just society. How you might ask? Just as Clifford Lincoln once said ... 'rights are rights are rights ... so are laws, are laws, are laws.

Further complicating the land of the Stars and Stripes is the new social-political-cultural reality of "Not United, But Divided, We Stand and Will Stand Untill America, The Once Great Beacon on the Hill Falls Apart. Pro-Death, Pro-Life, Liberty versus Oppression of the governed by the governing ruling class, Black Lives Matter striking against Blue Lives, White lives, Brown lives, Asian lives ... what is the point exactly? that only your tribe matters while the others must be put down because of your biased mission. Socialism perceived as failing all over the world, both now and then, corrupting and carving its way into the free-market capitalism that has shaped the economic life line of the country for centuries. Globalists attacking isolationists, one side optimistically believing in a united world, the other intensely fearful of takeover from an unstoppable all-powerful

Traditionalists are apprehensive about the destruction of values such as natural sexual identities, nuclear family foundations, ill-conceived, ill-perceived Green-Deal aspirations threatening what are believed to be tried and true strategies in managing the planet's resources. The list of challenges is endless, the solutions scarce, due primarily to the chasm created by political ideologies which neither understand, nor respect each other's values, intentions, or motivations. By the dawn's early light, and by the darkness at noon, America is in deep trouble, seemingly having abandoned the one singular redeeming belief and raison d'étre of In God We Trust.

On our own doorstep, is Canada a country that is fundamentally unified by common purpose, common ground, and common truth that from sea to shining sea, is still the true, north, strong, and free? Notice that it's not a compromised true, north, strong and free by arbitrary option, it is the true, north, strong and free by virtue and provisions of The British North America Act, The Canadian Bill of Rights, and The Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms.

Yes, it can still be argued that since Québec was not a signatory of the Charter of Rights and Freedoms, the province which self-describes as a nation, has access to options, such as the notorious notwithstanding clause of the Charter, by which it can circumvent the rights of some Québecers to live in a country united from sea to shining sea; linked by the values and principles that all can share, and in the truest sense of fairness and justice, be genuinely tolerant and respectful of individual differences that are part and parcel of a country whose people are served by both a national government of parliamentary democracy and 13 individual governments blessed with similar applications of parliamentary democracy.

These self-evident truths and rights, it must be emphasized, are guaranteed through both historical precedent and the provisions of all legislation enacted since, and including, The British North America of 1867. But it is crucial that these truths and rights be considered, thought about and evaluated in view of recent Québec legislation associated with Bill 21, Bill

40, Bill 96 – all accompanied by risks that these laws will not withstand the legal challenges they face, and God knows what else is coming down the CAQ National Assembly majority pipeline, depending of course on what comes to pass after the October 2022 Québec election which is only six weeks away.

So where does the True North stand in its 155th year? In Québec, sad to say, it does not stand on 'guard for thee', it sits instead apart from many other parts of the country where the Maple Leaf is proudly flown, giving witness to the pride Canadians feel toward one of the world's safest, fairest, most open-to-optimism geographical entities that is the envy of the rest of the planet.

Ah, yes, but Québec is on the move, as is daily reflected in the linguistic and cultural divisive initiatives espoused by the current centrist powers that be, challenged on the right by the emergent Conservative voice of Eric Duhaime and on the left by the extreme Québec Solidaire, the confused and confusing PQ, and several one-pony splinter groups desperately trying to fill the vacuum created by the conspicuous absence of a *Liberal* alternative having little or no connection with the will of Québecers. Nationalists, federalists, sovereignists and many other ists look for a political party they can vote for, not because it reflects all their values, but because it approximates enough of their values to reassure them that better days are ahead.

Is there light at the end of the post-2022 tunnel, despite the enormous challenges to be confronted, including the interminable hellish unfolding of the accursed Covid-19 pandemic, which the incessantly necessitated vaccine injections don't seem to do the job in protecting the citizenry who complies with the imposition of the jab and those who refuse to it? It is hoped that the answer will come sooner than later, from time and the river of human ingenuity.

Saint-Eustache fight climate change by planting an additional 800 trees

As part of the Major greening plan, the City of Saint-Eustache announced on August 22, 2022 the planting of 800 additional trees in the street right-of-way (strip of land) belonging to the City, in front or laterally of private properties that do not already have a tree.

This operation will be used to combat urban heat islands, reduce greenhouse gas emissions and promote biodiversity. By increasing the forest cover in this way, the City is taking concrete action to increase its canopy index and, consequently, to fight against global warming, which requires immediate, concrete and targeted actions. Owners of priority residences will be notified by letter and will be able to indicate their preferences from among a variety of tree species selected by the City for their environmental and aesthetic qualities. All relevant information is available on the City's website at saint-eustache. ca/greening.

"In addition to being one of the most effective ways to fight climate change, it has also been proven that trees help reduce air conditioning costs and reduce stress, in addition to acting on the behavior of drivers who, in tree-lined streets, are inclined to slow down. As a final benefit, properties with trees generally have a higher resale value than non-treed properties. ", said the mayor of Saint-Eustache, Pierre Charron.

"Over the next four years, we will plant more than 4,000 trees on Eustachian territory,"



said municipal councilor and president of the Environment and Beautification Commission, Isabelle Lefebvre. "Already this year, in addition to these 800 trees, we have planted 500 new trees in municipal parks and distributed 120 trees free of charge to citizens. That's 1,420 more trees to green our city. ", she added.

"My symbolic tree" contest

In addition to being beneficial for the environment, this new contest can also have a symbolic value. The City of Saint-Eustache invites the new owners of these trees to give them a personal meaning. Whether it's the commemoration of a milestone event or the beginning of a project

close to their hearts (marriage, birth, new job, etc.), they are invited to explain to the city by email the meaning that it is sent to <u>communications@saint-eustache.ca</u>. A draw will take place on November 18, 2022 among the participants. Two winners will win a \$500 gift card redeemable in Eustachian nurseries.


Back-to-school planner

A guide to insulated food containers

If you don't have easy access to a microwave at school, consider packing your lunch in an insulated food container. This is an ideal way to enjoy hot meals. Here are some things to keep in mind if you plan to purchase one.

WHAT TO BUY

Since an insulated food container won't retain heat as long if it's only half full, choose a model based on the typical portion size you go for. Opt for a container with a large opening, as it'll be easier to fill and clean. Additionally, look for terms such as "double wall" and "vacuum insulation" in the product description to ensure

If you select a stainless-steel insulated food container, keep in mind that this material is highly efficient at retaining heat. Therefore, you'll need to make sure it's cool enough to the touch that there's no risk of getting burnt.

meals stay hot for more

than a few hours.

HOW TO USE IT

Never put an insulated food container in the microwave. Instead, fill it with boiling water and let it sit for at least 10 minutes. Additionally, heat the food to a high temperature (too hot to eat right away) before placing it in the container. This will prevent bacteria growth. If you heat up a meal in the microwave, stir it to ensure the heat is evenly distributed before

you place it in the container. Be sure to immediately seal the lid.

> Note that food won't stay hot for long in an insulated food container unless there's some liquid in it. Therefore, avoid dishes such as fried rice and grilled meats, and opt instead for soups, stews and chili.

Finally, even if the manufacturer claims the container is dishwasher safe, it's best to clean it by hand. This will ensure it stays in good condition and won't lose its thermal capabilities. If there's a lingering scent in the container, fill it with hot water and baking soda, and let it sit for a few hours.




